2009-10 Season Preview

What a difference a season makes.

A season ago, the Central Michigan women's basketball team was coming off a 6-23 season under then first-year head coach Sue Guevara. The Chippewas quickly washed the bad taste of that season from their mouths, starting 7-2 on their way to a breakout 18-14 campaign in 2008-09.

The numbers from the 2008-09 season speak for themselves: third-best turnaround in the history of the Mid-American Conference (10.5 games), fourth in the nation in scoring (78.3 ppg), eighth in the nation in made threes (8.0), 11th in the nation in turnover margin (4.97) and 13th in the nation in steals (11.4).

CMU also ended a 16-game postseason losing streak with a win over Akron in the opening round of the MAC Tournament.

The season also featured numerous individual honors. Brandie Baker became just the second Chippewa to earn MAC Freshman of the Year honors, Britni Houghton put together one of the best offensive seasons in program history to earn second-team All-MAC honors and Angel Chan hit a program record 92 threes to earn honorable mention All-MAC honors. Kaihla Szunko also became just the second player in CMU history to lead the conference in rebounding (9.8 rpg).

Central lost just two players off last year's roster, but they were key contributors. Chan's 2.9 threes per contest ranked eighth in the nation and Latisha Luckett finished her career ninth on CMU's career steals chart and provided energy and rebounding as CMU's first sub.

But perhaps the biggest loss of the season comes on the injury front: Baker, who set a program record with 1,111 minutes played a season ago, will miss the entire season after suffering an injury in preseason workouts.

In the backcourt, CMU will have to replace Brandie Baker and Chan, who made 63 of a possible 64 starts a season ago.

The newcomers feature a set of twins and a speedy point guard from Chicago, and all three are expected to see a lot of minutes this season. Stefanie and Rachel Mauk are three-point snipers who will fit right in offensively and Jalisa Olive is a quick, aggressive point guard who will be important as CMU searches for a replacement for Baker at the point.

In addition to the three newcomers, junior Shonda Long's (8.6 points, 1.7 three-pointers in 2008-09) role will continue to increase. She largely served as a spark off the bench last season and starting 17 games as a freshman. She improved her game in nearly every statistical area as a sophomore, and could see minutes at a variety of spots in the lineup.

Seniors Kendra Holman and Heidi Warczinsky, junior Camille Ramsey and Olive will compete for the lions share of minutes as the team's point guard. Warczinsky appeared in 30 games a season ago, Holman in 21 and Ramsey in nine.

Up front, the Chippewas return all of their key contributors from a season ago and add Laura Baker, a transfer from Lansing Community College and older sister of Brandie.

Houghton was just the second player in CMU history to score 500 points in a season (533), becoming the 17th player in program history to cross the 1,000-point threshold and just the fifth to do it prior to her senior season. The senior sits 10th on CMU's all-time scoring list.

Szunko, a junior, showed almost no ill effects after missing all of the 2007-08 season with an injury, and continued to get better as the season progressed. Her .559 field goal percentage ranked seventh on CMU's single season list and finished 25th in the nation in rebounding with her MAC-best 9.8 boards per contest. She finished with a team-best 12 double-doubles and had five games of 15 or more rebounds.

Sophomore Skylar Miller started 21 games as a freshman and will be asked to bolster a Chippewa rebounding attack that lost 5.9 boards per game due to Brandie Baker's injury. Junior Sherryia Armstrong also returns after appearing in 21 games a season ago. The two are expected to compete for minutes with Laura Baker.

Junior Sarah Huff, a transfer from Marist, also joins CMU this season but will be required to sit out the year due to transfer rules.

Interviews

All coach and player interviews must be arranged through Assistant SID Mike Boseak at least 24 hours in advance. There will be no player interviews on game day prior to tipoff. Players and coaches are generally available following practice during the week, or by appointment if necessary.

CMU practices are generally closed to outside parties unless arrangements are made in advance. Radio and television crews are asked to complete any pregame interviews with head coach Ernie Zeigler prior to two hours before tipoff.

Postgame Interviews

Both head coaches and requested players will be brought to the media room after a 10-minute cooling off period, with the visiting coach and players speaking first. Full statistical packets will be available at this time. The CMU locker room is closed to all outside parties.

Chippewa Nickname

The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has approved the continued use of the nickname "Chippewas" in association with CMU. The university's goals are to use the name with honor and respect, increase supportive connections between CMU and Native Americans, and improve efforts to sensitize students, faculty, and staff to Native American traditions and cultures.

Media representatives have been extremely cooperative as we have worked to address this important issue. In nearly all cases, print and broadcast reporters have supported CMU's efforts to eliminate the use of symbols, headlines, and copy that present inappropriate and inaccurate images of Native Americans.

Central Michigan University is grateful for your help, and we ask for your continued cooperation and sensitivity. With your assistance, we can continue to use the Chippewa name with dignity and respect.

First Impressions -- Freshmen Jalisa Olive and Stefanie Mauk made quite the first impressions in CMU's exhibition game against Saginaw Valley. Olive finished with 25 points on 9-of-15 shooting, five offensive rebounds, three assists and six steals in just 16 minutes against the Cardinals. Mauk hit five threes in her Chippewa debut, finishing with 17 points in 16 minutes. The duo were Central's top two scorers.

Best in Class -- Freshman Brandie Baker was named the 2009 MAC Freshman of the Year following her first collegiate season. She is just the second Chippewa to earn the award; the other was CMU's all-time leading scorer Sue Nissen. Baker is also the first member of the Maroon and Gold to earn All-Freshman squad honors since Erin Kuhl in 2003.

Tough Break -- Sophomore Brandie Baker will miss the entire 2009-10 season after suffering an injury in preseason workouts.

All-MAC Talent -- Britni Houghton was named a second team All-MAC choice in 2008-09, following her third team selection in 2007-08. She is the first Chippewa to earn first or second team honors since 1997. 2008-09 was the first season that Central has had two or more players earn postseason All-MAC honors since 1999, when Joni Daniels and Sally Sedlar were named honorable mention. Britni Houghton (second team), Angel Chan (honorable mention) and Brandie Baker (all-freshman) gave CMU three honorees for the first time since 1998 when Julie Miller and Ebony Rainge were named honorable mention, and Joni Daniels earned all-freshman accolades.

Historic Turnaround -- CMU orchestrated the third-best turnaround in Mid-American Conference history in 2008-09. The Chippewas went 18-14, a season after finishing 6-23. The 10.5 game improvement is the best in school history, and was just behind Kent State's 11.0 game turnaround by the 1990-91 squad. The Chippewas finished 9-7 in MAC action a season ago, a 6.5 game improvement from their 2-13 finish in 2007-08. That improvement was good for the second-best turnaround in league play, behind only the 1985-86 Ohio squad that improved by 10.0 games.

Protect This House -- The Chippewas won 10 home games (10-3) in 2008-09, the most since the 1983-84 campaign. The Chippewas went 6-2 against MAC opponents at Rose Center, the first time CMU had won at least six home league games since the 1992-93 season.

Recess in Rose -- CMU won the NCAA's Pack the House Challenge for the MAC a season ago, after creating a now annual event known as "Recess in Rose". The event, which features an educational program for local elementary schools, brought a record 4,478 fans into Rose Center for last season's Nov. 25 game against Valparaiso. This year's "Recess in Rose" game is Nov. 25, vs. Georgetown.

Snap the Skid -- CMU snapped a 16-game postseason losing skid that dated back to 1992 last season, beating Akron in the opening round of the Mid-American Conference tournament.

Six Pack -- The Chippewas had six players score in double figures twice last season. It's the first time a CMU team had accomplished that feat twice in the same season in program history, and the occurrences were the first since 2003. Six players have reached double-figures five times in CMU history.

Lighting Up the Board -- Games involving the Maroon and Gold featured the most combined points in the nation last season. CMU's 153.3 combined scoring average was not only more than any other in the country, but the only in the nation higher than 150.0. The 2,505 points scored by CMU last season were the most in program history.

Chan's A Pro -- Departed senior Angel Chan signed a pro contract with Arxil Pontevedra in the LF2 League in Pontevedra, Spain. Chan hit a CMU record 92 threes last season, shattering the previous record of 77. She also became the 18th player in CMU history to score at least 1,000 points in her career.

"C" Notes -- CMU scored 109 points against Kent State on Feb. 4, 2009. It's the third-most in a single game in school history and the 203 combined points (109-94) were a school record. The Chippewas also set the single game mark for three-pointers made in a contest with 14. The Maroon and Gold have nine 100-point contests in their history.

Three Machines -- CMU had three players crack the program's single season three-pointers made list in 2008-09. Angel Chan set the top all-time mark with 92, Shonda Long finished with 53 (t-5th) and Brandie Baker hit 51 (t-7th). The Chippewas hit 255 three pointers in 2008-09. It's the most in program history, crushing the old record of 189 in Sue Guevara's first year at CMU. It's the third-most triples hit in a season in the history of the MAC, narrowly behind the 262 hit by Ball State in 2001-02.

Gotta Get to 70 -- Central Michigan is 2-23 when scoring fewer than 70 points under head coach Sue Guevara. CMU was 0-18 when failing to score 70 in Guevara's first year, and 2-5 in 2008-09 when they fell short of the mark. Five of the seven occurrences last year came in the season's final seven games, including both wins. The Chippewas are 22-14 when breaking the 70-point mark under Coach Guevara.

20-point Prowess -- The Chippewas have had a player score 20-plus points on 40 occasions in head coach Sue Guevara's two seasons (61 games). CMU had just 14 such scoring outputs in its previous 114 games.

You Got Szunked -- Kaihla Szunko put together an amazing season in 2008-09 just months after recovering from a torn ACL. She led the MAC in rebounding (9.8) and both offensive (3.88) and defensive (5.97) rebounds, finished third in field goal percentage (.559), tied for sixth in steals (1.94), 10th in blocked shots (0.84) and finished 28th in the MAC in scoring (10.5). She also finished 26th in minutes played (28.69). The sophomore was just the second Chippewa in MAC history to pace the field in boards. Only Vershaun Jones (2002) can also claim that feat.

Tough to Replace -- Brandie Baker played a program-record 1,111 minutes last season. She is expected to redshirt this season, after suffering an injury in preseason workouts. Baker and graduating senior Angel Chan made 63 of a potential 64 starts in CMU's backcourt in 2008-09.

No Triple-Double Trouble -- Brandie Baker narrowly missed the first triple-double in CMU women's basketball history against Kent State (2/4/09). Baker finished with 15 points, 10 assists and seven boards along with four swipes in her best collegiate effort to date. The 10 assists are the most by a CMU player since Priscilla Poole's 11 vs.Tri-State on Nov. 19, 2004. Her second close call came against Toledo (3/2), when she finished with 22 points, eight boards and seven dimes.

High Powered Duo -- Britni Houghton (533 points) and Angel Chan (459) combined for the most points by teammates in school history. Houghton's effort was just the second 500-point scoring season in school history, and she became the 17th player in program history to cross the 1,000-point barrier, just the fifth to do it prior to her senior season.

Hang It Up -- Sue Nissen, CMU's only three-time first-team All-MAC selection in program history, became the first female athlete in school history to have her jersey retired in a ceremony held at Rose Center last season. Nissen is the program's all-time leader in points scored, field goals made and three-pointers made.

Keep it Under 45 -- CMU is 6-24 under Sue Guevara when allowing its opponent to shoot 45 percent or better from the field. The Chippewas went 0-15 in Guevara's first season in such situations and 6-9 a year ago. The 45-percent mark also seemed to be a benchmark offensively last season for CMU, with the Chippewas posting an unblemished 8-0 mark when cracking 45 percent. The Chippewas were 14-5 in 2008-09 when hitting a mere 40 percent of its shots.

Get 'Em Next Year -- Junior forward Sarah Huff transferred to CMU from Marist last summer. She must sit out the year due to transfer rules.

CMU wins Cartwright Award for Program Excellence -- Central Michigan University won the MAC's inaugural Cartwright Award, given to the program that most comprehensively exemplifies success academically, athletically and in the community. The Chippewas were named the league's top overall program for the 2008-09 season.

New CMU Events Center Construction Underway -- Rose Center has hosted Central Michigan basketball since 1973-74 season. This is the final season in the building's current configuration. The existing court was purchased in June of 1986 and used only once prior, at the 1986 NBA All-Star game. It's hosted events such as the 1980 AIAW Division I National Championship and in 1984 it hosted the first round games of the women's basketball NCAA tournament. A \$21 million renovation of Rose Center was approved by the Central Michigan board of trustees on July 16, 2009. The privately funded Events Center will include a completely redesigned angular exterior and bright glazed-glass entrance, a 10,000 square-foot lobby and reception area, a redesigned arena bowl with upgraded comfortable seating for 5,300, a new 12,000 square-foot practice facility, enhancements to the student fitness center and additional academic teaching space. Officials broke ground on Sept. 26, and the project is expected to be completed in time for the 2010-11 basketball seasons.

CMU Fast Break:

- The Chippewas have had a 20-point scorer in 30 of their past 42 contests dating back to 2007-08
- The Chippewas were 18-5 last season when leading or tied at halftime, but failed to win a game in which they trailed at the break (0-9). CMU failed to overcome a deficit larger than six points in 2008-09.
- CMU set a women's basketball attendance record vs. Valparaiso on Nov. 25, 2008 (4,478). The previous program record was set against Western Michigan on Feb. 18, 1987 (4,351).
- CMU defeated both of its in-state MAC rivals (Eastern and Western Michigan) in the same season in 2008-09. It's the first time since the 1997-98 campaign they beat both schools in the same campaign. CMU also swept the season series with both schools for the first time since 1994.
